Math Facts	Recess	<u>Specialty</u> Classes/Rotations
All 3 <sup>rd</sup> grade students should be able to add and subtract fluently within 1000, as well as multiply and divide fluently within 100. Students need to be practicing these facts <u>at least</u> 5 min. per day, 5x per week. It is CRUCIAL that all students memorize the basic addition/subtraction facts AND the basic multiplication/division facts.	Students play outside unless a "red flag recess" is called. ## <u>Homework</u>

Homework will mainly consist of reading and practicing basic math facts (add, subtract, multiply, divide). A reading log with a writing response section and math facts log will be sent home on Monday and due back on Friday.

\*Students will be asked to **read 100 minutes per week** as well as **respond to one reading question per week**.

\*Students will be asked to review basic math facts <u>at least</u> 3x per week for 5 minutes each time.

\*Students will be asked to **review spelling & vocabulary words** several times during the week in preparation for a spelling/vocabulary test each Friday.

## Friday Fun!

Students who complete ALL of the assigned homework will receive full credit and be able to participate in a "Friday Fun" activity. Students who do not complete the homework/turn it in on time will stay with a 3<sup>rd</sup> grade teacher and complete the missing work, etc.

## Duet (or Dyad) Reading

You are invited to participate in Duet Reading this year. Take a book, magazine or news article on the target goal level (3<sup>rd</sup> Grade) and read it ALOUD TOGETHER, AT THE SAME TIME as your child, for 15 minutes daily. Practice reading together fluently and with a fun story voice. Your child should work hard to keep up with you. You should read as naturally as possible with both inflection and rate. It is fine to stop and talk about what you are reading. Research has shown that this practice is extremely beneficial for helping students make incredible gains as a reader in both fluency and comprehension.

\*Idea: Your 3<sup>rd</sup> Grader could then read with younger siblings using their target level (K, 1, or 2 Grade). What a fun way to help everyone in the family improve as readers!
